

Installation Instructions

Follow these instructions to install SpoolMail V2R7M0 on your System i:

Prepare

If you are upgrading a previous release (if SpoolMail is currently installed on your System i) perform these steps before installing the software:

1. Read the Enhancement Summary to determine if any changes affect your installation.
2. Insure that the product is not in use, as the installation process must clear the product's library. This will fail if objects such as menus are in use. If the installation fails, the previous release will be restored.

Install

Note: If you have downloaded this software from the web, instructions specific to installing from the download can be found in the file "readme.htm" which was included.

1. Sign on to the system as the security officer (QSECOFR).
2. Verify that your machine is at IBM i V6R1M0 or later by running:

```
DSPDTAARA DTAARA (QGPL/QSS1MRI)
```

Note: If you are running a version of IBM i earlier than V6R1M0 you cannot install SpoolMail V2R7M0 on your machine. You must install an earlier version of SpoolMail or upgrade the operating system.

3. Verify that user domain objects are allowed in the libraries SPOOLMAIL and QSRV, by running:

```
WRKSYSVAL SYSVAL (QALWUSRDMN)
```

Take option 5 to display the value. If the value is not *ALL, use option 2 to add libraries SPOOLMAIL and QSRV to the list of libraries where user domain objects are allowed.

Note: QSRV is required to correctly process PTFs when they are loaded and applied.

4. Insure that IBM i will be able to verify the signatures that we apply to our product's objects by installing our Signing Certificate and Root CA Certificate using Digital Certificate Manager. Alternately, insure that signature verification will not prevent the restore operation by running:

```
WRKSYSVAL SYSVAL (QVfyOJBjRST)
```

Take option 5 to display the value. If the value is 3 or higher, use option 2 to temporarily change the value to 1.

5. Mount the distribution media in the appropriate device.
6. Submit the Restore Licensed Program (RSTLICPGM) command to batch:

```
RSTLICPGM LICPGM(2A55SM1) DEV(device-name) LNG(2924)
```

Note: Where "device-name" is the device the media was mounted on and is usually OPT01.

Note: During the restore operation, the system operator message queue may receive inquiry message CPA3DE4 "Directory not registered. (C G)". Unless you are using a directory naming convention similar to ours (that is the directory specified in the CPA3DE4's second level text is unrelated to our software), you can safely respond with a "G" to reestablish the relationship between the directory and the product. Typically, the message will occur three times.

Finish

When the RSTLICPGM command completes, library SPOOLMAIL and directory '/Gumbo/ProdData/2A55SM1' contain the new software. To complete the installation:

1. If you have an Authorization letter with your permanent authorization code, enter it now.

Note: SpoolMail automatically grants 30 days usage for new installs or 90 days usage for release upgrades.

2. Retrieve the current cumulative PTF package by running the following command:

```
SPOOLMAIL/RTVGSIPTF
```

Note: **GUMBO** recommends downloading the current cumulative PTF package from www.gumbo.com after installing the software.

3. You can access the SpoolMail menu by running the following command:

```
GO MENU (SPOOLMAIL/SPOOLMAIL)
```

Enhancements For SpoolMail V2R7M0

What's In This Section

This section provides information on SpoolMail enhancements for release V2R7M0, notes any customer code implications by marking them with a **COMPATIBILITY WARNING**, and describes where to find more information when applicable.

*HTMLCSS Transform Added

New transform *HTMLCSS has been added. The transform updates html to the current standards and allows a custom style sheet to be included. A related new parameter, Style sheet (HTMCSS), has also been added.

With the parameter you can include a cascading style sheet to provide custom styling. The contents of the stream file are copied, unaltered and uninspected, into the generated html. The contents are placed within a <style></style> tag pair in the head section of the document.

If no style sheet is specified the default is included:

```

The behavior of transform *HTMLBASIC is unaltered.

AES-256 Encryption Implemented

Encryption using 256-bit Advanced Encryption Standard (AES) has been added to Element 7: Encryption specification of the PDF document security (PDFDOCSEC) parameter. To encrypt PDF documents with AES256, specify *V5. The generated document can be viewed with Acrobat Reader 9.0 or later.

Retrieve Gumbo PTF (RTVGSIPTF) Command Added

Previously, loading and applying PTFs for SpoolMail required a visit to www.gumbo.com, downloading a file and many manual steps. We've added a command to automate the process.

The Retrieve Gumbo PTF (RTVGSIPTF) command checks a remote system for new product PTFs, and, if available, downloads and installs them.

The command assumes that the System i has connectivity to the PTF server. Unless you are running your own internal server hosting our PTFs, this means that the System i has access to the internet and that FTP is not blocked by a firewall.

The command first checks the availability of new PTFs by retrieving a product and release specific file (Ex. q2m70LastPtf.txt) from the remote system and comparing its contents to the last PTF applied locally. If newer PTFs are available, a product and release specific PTF save file (Ex. q2m70all.svf) is downloaded, and the PTFs it contains are loaded and applied.

Note: **GUMBO** only delivers immediate PTFs. Immediate PTFs do not require an IPL and an IPL is never performed by the command.

The previous method of supplying PTFs will be supported until all supported product releases contain RTVGSIPTF and until the vast majority of customers are using RTVGSIPTF. At a minimum this will be several years.

Include object (INCOBJ) Enhanced

SpoolMail's Include object (INCOBJ) parameter now supports specification of "multipart/alternative" groups. For example, you can specify a text version of an email's message and an alternative HTML version, relying on the recipient's mail client to select among them.

New SRCCSID *SPLF Special Value

A new special value, *SPLF, has been added to the coded character set id (SRCCSID) parameter. When specified, the spooled file's attributes are inspected to determine its CCSID. This is beneficial on systems that support multiple languages.

SEND(*ATTACH) Reinterpreted

When SEND(*ATTACH) is specified (the default), and when an html transform is specified, the MIME part is added with content type "text/html". When SEND(*ATTACH) is specified (the default), and when a txt transform is specified, the MIME part is added with content type "text/plain". Previously the part was added as "application/octet-stream".

***TXTTRIM Allowed With SEND(*TEXTPLAIN)**

SNDSPLMAIL's parameter dependencies have been changed to allow TRANSFORM(*TXTTRIM) when SEND(*TEXTPLAIN) is specified. Previously, only *TXT was allowed.

***DFT Extensions Now Lower Case**

Previously, file extensions generated by SNDSPLMAIL when EXTENSION(*DFT) is specified, were upper case. Generated extensions are now lower case. If your processing depends on the attached file having an upper case extension, specify the extension directly.

Message Parameter Enhanced

SNDSPLMAIL's Message (MSG) parameter has been enlarged from 2048 to 5000 bytes in length. Additionally, a send as element was added which allows specification of *TEXTPLAIN or *TEXTHTML content type. No program changes are required.

Font Processor Changes

- Enhanced processing for api QGSLRSC. Previously, processing was ended if the api issued any error. Now the spooled file resource list is inspected for useable data after an error is returned.
- Corrected message handling when api QGSLRSC returns an error. Previously the error returned by api QGSLRSC was either replaced by another or dropped.
- An erroneous entry in an internal font table resulted in incorrect FGID substitution for user defined FGIDs in the range 65280 to 65379.
- Previously, font parsing could produce errors or failed processing. The problem situation arose when identically named, but different, font resources were simultaneously parsed and the timing of the processing was unlucky. Luck is no longer required to get correct results.

Integrated File System Changes

- Added missing message id IFS1014 and IFS1016.
- Corrected usage of message id IFS1014 and IFS1016.
- Functions were added for creating and removing hard links for stream files.

Mail Set Up Changes

- DSPMAILLOG was sending a "no data available" message regardless of the reason for failure of the DSPJRN command. Command now sends an "error encountered" message for DSPJRN failures unless the failure is CPF7062 "No entries converted ...".

National Language Support Changes

- Added new function to resolve ccsid of a spooled file from its attributes.

Logical Printer Miscellaneous Changes

- A new section was added the manual's Implementation chapter to describing authority adoption used by Gumbo Logical Printers and how to remove it.

PDF Generator Changes

- Previously, bit mapped images with more than 1 bit per pel resulted in an unviewable file. Now all bit depths are processed correctly.
- Previously, applying *EXACT to an unknown *FGID resulted in incorrect processing of the substituted *FGID.
- Previously when imbedding type 3 fonts, scaling of raster font character bit images into font space assumed that the B_space dimension was coincident with the left and right edge of the raster bounding box. This is true for almost all, but not all, fonts. Now scaling is calculated based on a conversion from raster space to font space.
- The range of the length element of the PDF bookmark data source (PDFBKMSRC) parameter has been increased to 255 from 64.
- PTF changes introduced an error. If TXTRELPOS() was set to *EXACT or *EXACTMOD, and a monospace font was specified in an *AFPDS or *IPDS spooled file, positioning errors could occur. The error is corrected.

Program Distribution Changes

- A new object signing certificate, to replace the previously used and expiring one, was placed into service on our development systems. If you are using CHKOBJITG to verify the integrity of objects in our software, load the new certificate into the *SIGNATUREVERIFICATION certificate store.

Spool Indexing Changes

- The range of the length element of the Page data (PAGDTA) parameter has been increased to 255 from 64.

Send Mail Changes

- Added functions to process message body with specified content type.
- Improperly initialized variable resulted in garbage in message data for message id SND1009 and SND1030.
- Objects in unlinkable file systems now handled properly.
- New export to allow client to select synchronous vs. asynchronous processing and thus avoid a temporary directory used for asynchronous.

- Previously, included files sent as "text/html" used 8bit encoding (basically a straight copy). For signed email, this resulted in invalid signatures at the mail client. Additionally, the message arrived "quoted-printable"; presumably rewritten by IBM i. Encoding of "text/html" has been changed to "quoted-printable", avoiding the problem.
- Previously when adding files as attachments, calling functions had to insure that each file was available until the email was finalized and sent. Internal processing was changed to establish hard links to the files, allowing the calling function to delete them immediately.
- Previously, MIME parts were added to an email under construction without regard to order. I.e. parts were added as they were processed. While this behavior is compliant with the relevant MIME specifications, it befuddles some of the most popular email clients. Outlook treats text MIME parts preceded by an attachment as an attachment, giving it a name and failing to display it. In the same scenario, Thunderbird displays the text part as intended but also assigns a name and shows it in the list of attachments muddying the overall appearance of the message.

Now, generation of MIME parts is postponed until the full content of the email is known. Once known, the text MIME parts are processed first, placing them at the top of the email in the order received, followed by any and all attachments, again in the order received. In the case of alternative groups, if the first alternative is a text MIME part, all alternatives are moved as a group to the top of the email.

Spool Management Changes

- Enhanced processing for api QGSLRSC. Previously, processing was ended if the api issued any error. Now the spooled file resource list is inspected for useable data after an error is returned.
- Corrected message handling when api QGSLRSC returns an error. Previously the error returned by api QGSLRSC was either replaced by another or dropped.
